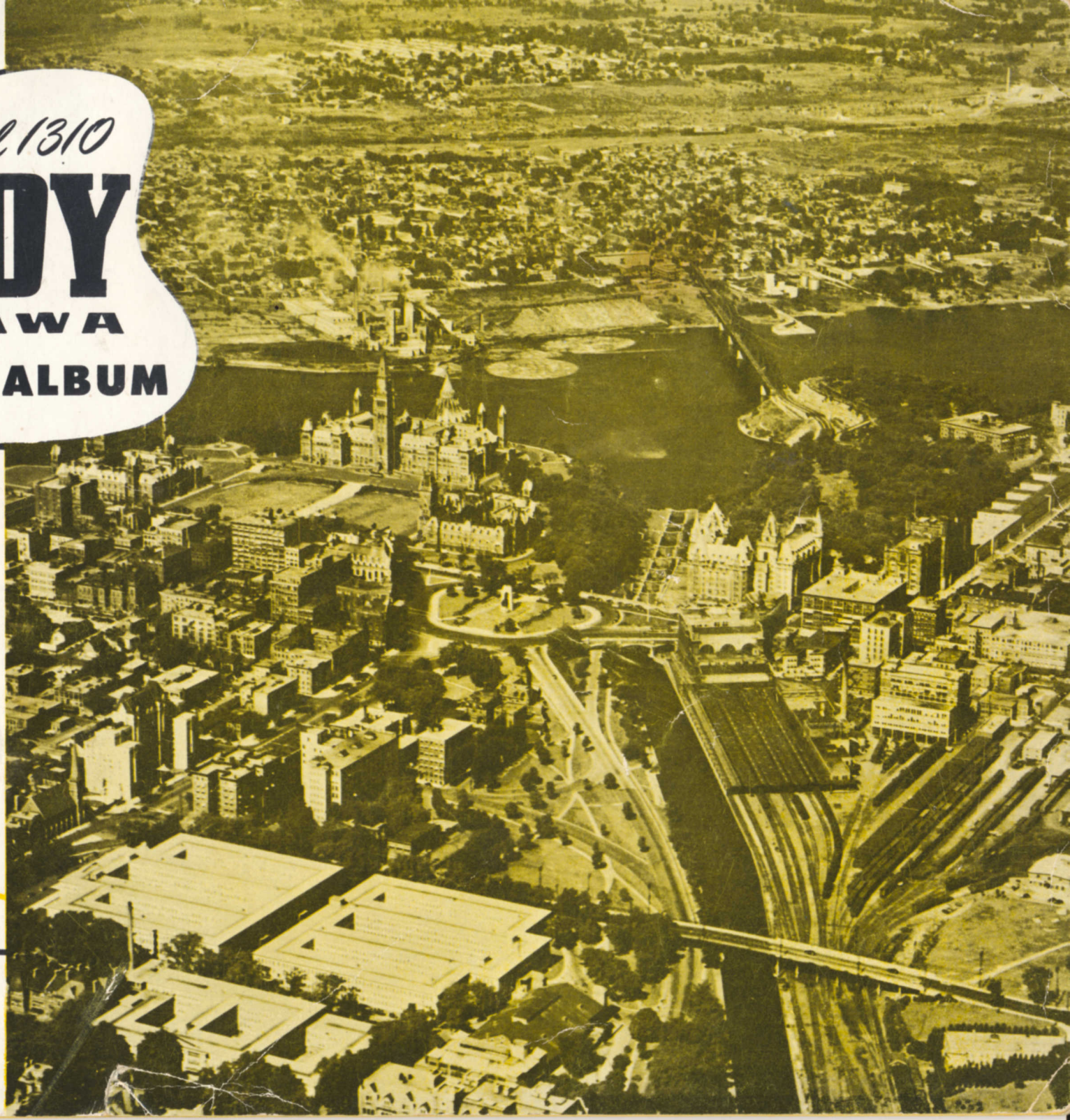

The radio station call letters "CKOY" were broadcast for the first time on June 1st, 1949, succeeding CKCO which had been in operation approximately 25 years. With studios located at 272 Somerset Street West in Ottawa, the Capital's most powerful station operates on a twenty-four hour daily schedule. CKOY's "Block Programming" is designed to please most of the people most of the time, with emphasis on "News on the Hour", the finest sports coverage and an abundance of music. Public Service activities gain special attention from "the Community Voice of Canada's Capital".



The transmitter building of Radio Station CKOY is located off the Aylmer Road, a short distance west of Hull, Quebec. CKOY operates on 1310 kilocycles on a full time basis, on five thousand watts daytime and one thousand watts nighttime.

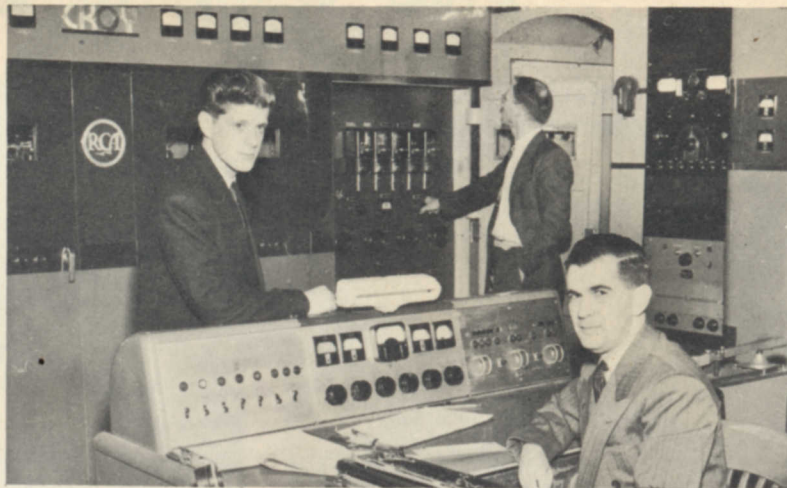

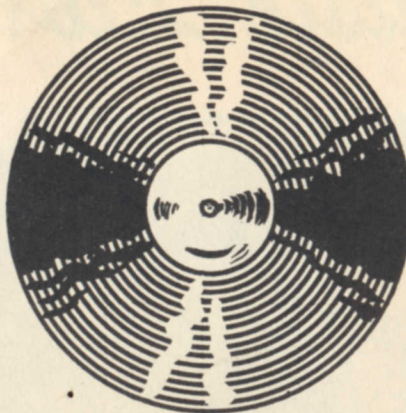

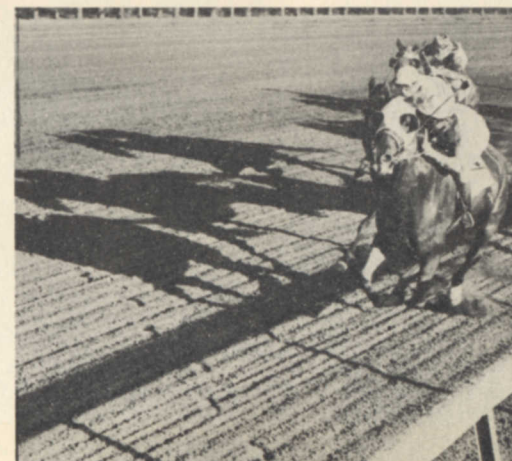

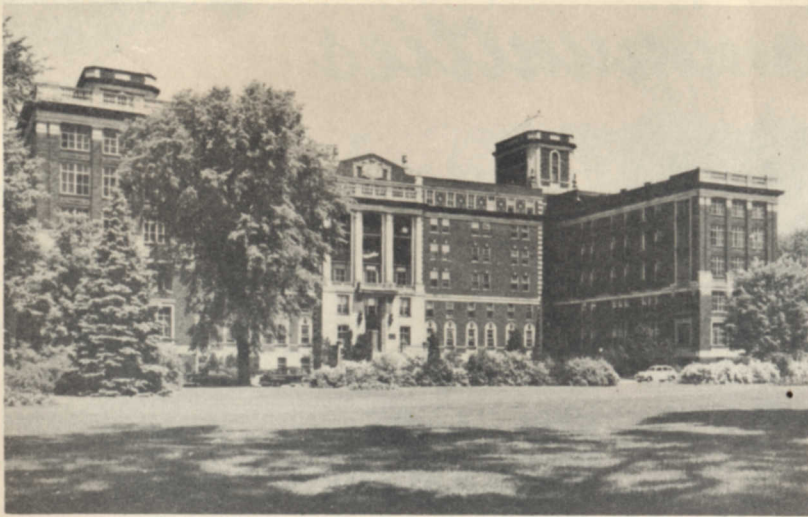
